AUTHOR INTERVIEW



Why did you write this book?

A Song in Her Heart was originally inspired by patients from an Alzheimer's care home. Women in this group could no longer remember loved ones' names, but they could still play the piano, dance, and sing the words to familiar songs. This fascinated me, so I based my writing on them. The original story was revised several times, but it just wasn't what I was looking for.

My mother developed Alzheimer's a few years ago. It is hard to see those you love slip away. She eventually forgot our names, and she grew quiet. My brother lived close to the nursing facility, and his family would visit each Sunday. They would sing hymns and mom would remember all the words. She would sing loud, and she looked at peace. This was a beautiful time when we could all connect with her again.

Mom showed us all that we can share our song in simple ways through the life we live. I wrote this book to honor her and help others find the song in their heart.

When did you know you wanted to write?

I began writing many years ago through my journals. I would write messages for ladies' groups, skits, short plays, and Bible Studies. Poetry was therapy for me.

In 2016 I moved out of my elementary classroom and began a writing program through our Title 1. I taught creative writing for K- 5th grade classrooms. One of our extensive projects each year was to write a book. My students would often tell me I ought to write a book as well. I agreed but felt I didn't have the time. So, after retiring, I began to take some writing classes and jumped right in!
